- 1. Let's try this again. I decided to give up my original concept of pain, because I really do not know enough about migraine headaches. I attempted mapping the concept of mowing my lawn, which I used as a frame in Module 4A. I did find out quickly that the simple concept kept growing and growing. I am sure that is a big hazard and caution with serious concept mapping. Please see the Lawn Mowing Concept Map on p. 2.
- 2. The possible attributes of the concepts that could be but are not included in the map:
  - Mapping of the steps to follow when using the other lawn equipment and supplies listed.
  - Include steps to clean-up and putting everything back in the garage.
  - Include steps of how the thinking and drinking took place (in a chair, under a shade tree, was it a long process, etc.).
  - Could have included the attributes of the way in which the determination that a lawn needs mowing is made or listed the conditions needed to determine when the lawn mowing should occur (how is the determination to mow the lawn arrived at).
  - Could have mentioned a time frame for different activities.
  - I know in one nursing sample concept map I saw, some of the attributes listed in the concept map were objective data, subjective data, orders to follow, referential diagnoses. These attributes could have also been implemented into the lawn mowing project or failure thereof.
